What we will be learning in year 5 and 6:

Class 5

Religion - Our RE topics this term are "Inspirational People" and "Reconciliation". We will also be taking part in class mass, gospel assemblies and singing on Mondays.

Literacy - We will begin by completing a non-fiction unit on the ancient Maya. This will be followed by a unit of persuasive writing linked to Fairtrade and then poetry, particularly 'Little Freak'. Next half term, we will be studying 'Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief' by Rick Riordan and Romeo and Juliet.

Maths - In Maths we will be covering Area, Perimeter & Shape, Multiplication & Division and Fractions.

Science - In Science, we will be exploring 'Living Things and their Habitats' and 'Forces'.

History - Our History Topic this term is "The Ancient Maya". We will be attempting to answer the enquiry question "Who were the ancient Mayans?"

Geography - We will be looking at Settlement and Migration and trying to answer the questions: Do settlements have a pattern? Why do people migrate? What happens to refugees?

Class 6

Religion - Our RE topics this term are "Exploring the Mass" and "Jesus the Messiah". We will also be taking part in class mass, gospel assemblies and singing on Mondays.

Literacy - We will be reading the book 'The Man Who Walked Between the Towers' this term before moving on to read 'Once' as our new class novel. The children will be revising the Key Stage 2 grammar curriculum and writing letters, diary entries and stories in the style of the authors they have studied.

Maths - In Maths we will be covering fractions and revisiting the four operations. We will also be looking at shape, measure and data handling.

Science - In Science we will be learning about Living Things and Their Habitats and Electricity.

History - Our History Topic this term is a local history study. The children will be learning about the impact of war on the local area.

Geography - We will be learning about South America.

Reminders:
